Thoughts from the congregation

"So Far Away" is the title of a popular song recorded by the British rock band Dire Straits. The chorus goes like this. "You're so far away from me. You're so far I just can't see. You're so far away from me. You're so far away from me." "So Far Away" is the opening track on their fifth studio album, "Brothers in Arms," released in 1985.

"Have You Ever Been Lonely?" is a song with music by Peter De Rose and lyrics by Billy Hill (writing under the name of George Brown). It has been recorded by many artists, but probably the most familiar version is a duet, though they never recorded together, by Patsy Cline and Jim Reeves. The electronically created duet was released in the fall of 1981.

So, what do these two songs have in common? Absolutely nothing. Bear with me, I'll try to make a connection.

As Christians we're taught to pray, to seek God's guidance and strength not just in times of trials but daily. In the book of 1 Chronicles, chapter 28, verse 9b we are told by the prophet Ezra, "If you seek him, he will be found by you...." (NIV) The prophet Jeremiah in chapter 29, verses 12-13 tells us God has said "Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all you heart." (NIV) In the Gospel of Matthew verses 32b-33 we are told Jesus said, "...your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (NIV) These are but three Scriptures through which we're told to "seek" God and we'll find him. That he will "listen." Again in the Gospel of Matthew it is recorded that Jesus promised, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matt, 28:20b, NIV)

So, you and I "seek" God daily and yet at times we don't see or feel any results, any solutions. We feel ignored, lost, lonely. We begin to think we've been forgotten. That God or his emissary the Holy Spirit are "so far away" neither hear the petition of our needs, or they are not being acknowledged. Why is that?

Could it be we are too self-focused, too self-centered, too self-absorbed? How many times in our communication with God do actually seek God's will? Are our prayers more akin to an Amazon wish list rather than an open communication with The Creator? Does our "thank you," rather than actually expressing gratitude, sound more like a child expressing thanks simply because he or she was told to do so? We seek relief from pain, from heartache, for a safe journey, for someone's return to good health. Yet we still suffer painful bodies, heartache of a lost loved one, become injured while traveling, and/or a close friend's or family member's health never seems to improve. We ask, why? Why has this happened? Why is this child not getting well? Why was this child's parent allowed to die? Why would it be God's will that such a thing occurred?

During such times it is entirely possible to feel all alone. To feel that God is so far away, too far removed. Have you ever felt like telling God, "You're so far away from me, you're so far I just can't see?" Have ever been lonely because you felt God's absence? Even Jesus asked God, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matt, chapter 27, verse 46b, NIV) If Jesus can feel "lonely" and that the love of his father is "so far away from me," we should not be surprised if we also do sometimes. But, just because we feel God is so far away, doesn't mean that God is not always with us.
