

Peace, Perfect Peace

Let There Be Peace on Earth, is the title of a song written by Jill Jackson-Miller and Sy Miller in 1955. It was initially written for and sung by the International Children's Choir. Jackson-Miller, who had been suicidal after the failure of her marriage to screenwriter Felix Jackson, said she wrote the song after what she called the, "Life-saving joy of God's peace and unconditional love." The song begins, "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me."

During the season on the church calendar called Advent a candle on the Advent Wreath is lit each Sunday representing hope, peace, joy, and love. All in preparation for the celebration of the birth of the Christ child, the Prince of Peace. So, with all of Christendom praying for peace, what has happened? Our world is in turmoil. In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus is recorded as telling his disciples, "See to it that no one misleads you. For many will come in My name saying 'I am the Christ,' and will mislead many. You will be hearing of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not frightened, for those things must take place, but that is not yet the end. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and in various places there will be famines and earthquakes. But all these things are merely the beginning of birth pangs." (Matt. 24:4b-8, NASB)

Now, am I saying we are in the "end times?" Hardly! For that has been done over and over, and over by those more scholarly than I. Then just what am I saying? I'm simply expressing my disgust in we human's failure to live up the call of Christ to, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments. This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you." (John 14:15 and 15:12, NASB)

Maybe we ought to earnestly take the lyrics of this song to heart and live these words. "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me. Let there be peace on earth. The peace that was meant to be. With God as our Father Brothers (and Sisters) all are we. Let me walk with my brother (and sister) in perfect harmony."

1 John 2:8-10, "...I am writing a new commandment to you, which is true in Him and in you, because the darkness is passing away and the true Light is already shining. The one who says he is in the Light and yet hates his brother is in the darkness until now. The one who loves his brother abides in the Light and there is no cause for stumbling in him." (NASB)

As we have now entered the new calendar year many of us will resume our day-to-day routines without another thought to the Advent wreath, its candles and their meanings. Even in church we "move on." We enter the period on the church calendar call epiphany. We're done with Advent for another year. But, quite possibly we should never move beyond Advent. Maybe we should be witnesses to the masses about the Prince of Peace. Maybe we should be a voice calling in today's wilderness. We should be providing our witness to "Good News." Christ, the Prince of Peace, is here. And praying, "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me."
